





The match started out tentatively with both teams looking to see how their opponents were set up for this contest. Goal scoring opportunities started to be created and this saw Manchester take advantage of loose marking in the Peterborough defence, on two occasions, for goals to be scored by Reuben Owen-Harris and Damaras Gordon.

Peterborough were struggling to find their rhythm but just before halftime a quick break by Michael Carter and Jake Reed saw the ball played wide to Jake who struck an accurate slapshot into the net from an acute angle.

Early in the second half Peterborough drew level. The Team Fouls count had reached 10 against Manchester and a direct hit awarded. Jake Reed stepped up and smashed his shot into the roof of the net

Loose marking, again, in the Peterborough defence allowed Damaras Gordon to calmly venture forward and flick his shot from 10 yards out into the net.

Peterborough 2 Manchester 3

Play continued to be end to end but Manchester found the next breakthrough. The ball was worked through to Ricardo Concepcion about 8 yards out from goal and he hit a fine slapshot past the unsighted Peterborough goalkeeper.

Peterborough 2 Manchester 4

The next action saw a key moment in this game. Having gone 4-2 down with 7 minutes left on the clock, Peterborough responded immediately with a fine move involving James Berry and Jake Reed. James worked the ball across the face of the Manchester goal and Jake cleverly lifted the ball into the net for his hattrick.

This third goal for Peterborough visually lifted the team. A move behind the Manchester goal involving Jake Reed and Michael Carter developed at speed to allow Michael to cleverly lift the ball into the air and place his shot into the net as he emerged from behind the goal.

Unfortunately, for Manchester, they conceded another pointless team foul which took the count for the match to 15 and the resultant direct hit was smashed home by Michael Carter to the relief of the Peterborough supporters.

Arthur Corr's (Peterborough Coach) Man of the Match:- **Michael Carter** - a real Captain's Performance. Rolled his sleeves up at 4-2 down and led by example to lift his team mates to victory.

This game marked the best attended home Premier League game of the season. Some new faces were there for the first time and it seems our recent coverage with Peterborough Community Radio has raised the curiosity, in the Peterborough area, of what Roller Hockey is all about.

Manchester's Game Plan worked for 43 minutes of this match. However, 15 team fouls finally caught up with them and as result Peterborough took full advantage by converting the resultant direct hits.

Manchester certainly showed that they were "up for this game" as they worked tirelessly in harassing and quickly shutting down the space that Peterborough were hoping to exploit.

With 7 minutes left on the clock Peterborough were down 4 goals to 2. However, what was reassuring to see was they were prepared to battle their way back into the match and finally emerge as victors in the end.

Full marks to the Manchester Coach, Dan Messenger, who cleverly used his in-depth knowledge of the Peterborough Team (his daughter, Lily, played in Peterborough's Premier Team last season) by coming up with a Plan that almost delivered the result he was hoping for.

A special mention to the oldest player on the rink, Damaras Gordon. He was telling me before the match started that he was now considered to be a veteran player as his birthday was last week and he is now 35 years of age. Well, as captain of Manchester in this match he led by example and played an outstanding game by scoring two goals and winning almost every tackle he went in for to belie his veteran status!

On the balance of play Manchester definitely deserved to get something from this match but as with all sports they can be cruel at times in not delivering the rewards for your efforts.

To the watching supporters of both Teams this was a match full of excitement with a grandstand finish that kept everybody on their toes right up to the final whistle.

Both referees did their best in keeping the match flowing with several "on the move team fouls" being awarded.

Arthur Corr (the Peterborough Coach) in particular, was delighted to see two visitors attend a Peterborough match for many, many years. They were ex.player Peter Johnson (who Arthur had not seen for 40 odd years and who played a starring role in the 1975 film, Rollerball, starring James Caan) and ex.President John Miller.
